2020 began like any other year. Who knew that by the end of the year, we would have to completely reimagine how we rescue, provide care for and adopt our companion animals. Our goal had always been to stay one step ahead of the curve. We knew that to continue helping as many animals as we could during this unprecedented time, we would have to take steps to ensure the safety of our staff, the public and our shelter pets.

Have you ordered curbside pick-up at your favorite restaurant? Well, that was our first step in creating a safe environment. That's right-curbside adoptions! Families would fill out adoption applications online, meet virtually with one of our staff and schedule a time to meet and adopt their new family member. This process was good for dogs but it proved more difficult to introduce families to cats and kittens.

The second step was to convert our catteries into meeting rooms where families could safely interact with our adoptable animals. In 2018, we created four large cages to house multiple cats in the same room. These structures have large glass doors that would act



as barriers to allow would-be adopters to safely interact with our adoption counselors. That is the way Trinity, formerly Elsa, met her forever family (see photo).

The final and most popular step we took was delivering pets right to your home. Uber Eats, meet Uber Pets! Friendship APL staff crisscrossed Northeast Ohio delivering furry bundles of joy to loving families. We put tens of thousands of miles on our cars, cleaned up tons of messes in our backseats and brought joy to hundreds of families struggling through the lockdown. This is how 8-week-old Scout (aka Finn) arrived at the doorstep of his amazing new family (see cover).

Our ability to quickly adapt to a year filled with turmoil allowed us to find adopters for our pets at an incredible rate. Sure, it was exhausting and sometimes smelly, but it worked. It allowed us to assist thousands of animals from local families struggling financially to care for their pets and rescue animals from overcrowded shelters.

Thankfully, our donors saw the amazing work we were doing and supported us throughout this difficult time. Their gifts made our work possible during a time when Friendship was needed more than ever!
